

## Peter Dingee

Peter Dingee was born July 16, 1766, most likely on his father's farm on the west side of Cherry Street of Katonah. He was one of ten children born to John Dingee and Sarah Moseman (sister of Captain Marcus Moseman, a noted Revolutionary War patriot.)

Bedford census records from 1797 to 1850 show Peter Dingee to be a resident farmer living in the Croton Lake Road - Cherry Street area. In 1793, he married Hannah Tyler, daughter of Eli and Esther Tyler. Hannah was the cousin of Jerusha Tyler who married the Reverend Ezra Fountain. The Dingees had two sons. Eli Tyler Dingee, and Jesse Tyler Dingee. When the boys were in their young teens their mother died (1811). Shortly thereafter (as was the custom in those days) Peter Dingee married Deborah Sarles and they had a daughter Betsey Ann. All three of Peter Dingee's children are buried in Buxton Cemetery along with a majority of his twenty grandchildren.

Hannah Tyler Dingee is buried beside her mother Esther in the Tyler plot. Peter's second wife Deborah is buried with her husband. Curiously, Deborah's gravestone had fallen over, but has gently been replaced leaning against that of her husband.
